United Heartland vs. National Average

With the aid of analytics, our on-site pharmacist and team of nurses continuously monitor opioid utilization. When an injured worker abuses opioids:

- · A company's bottom line can be negatively impacted.
- There are increased indirect costs such as lost time, including overtime for current staff or hiring temp staff.
- Employee morale can be diminished, resulting in lower production.
- There is a strong financial impact to the employer as the overall claim costs increase significantly.

United Heartland's opioid usage statistics are considerably below the national average in workers' compensation. Because the number of opioid prescriptions is less, and injured workers are using them for a shorter amount of time:

- · The risk of addiction significantly decreases.
- · They return to work sooner.
- · Overall claims costs go down significantly.

% Opioid Plan Cost




Average Days of use per Opioid Patient




Average Days per Opioid RX
